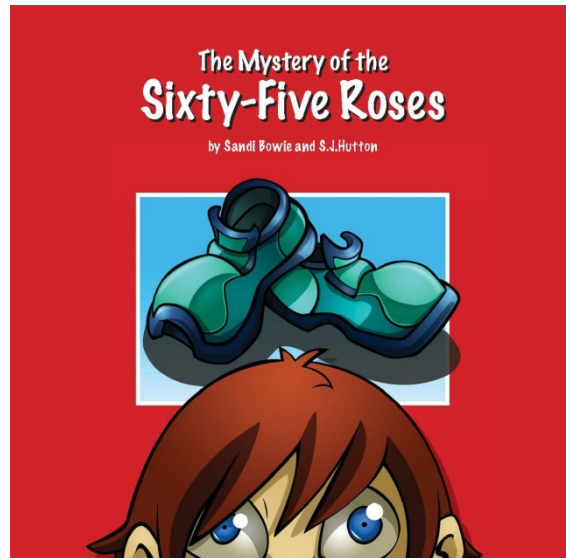
The national Cystic Fibrosis day in Australia, held on the last Friday in May is called Sixty-Five Roses Day.
